

## LOCATION





#### **GIWW Threatened**

- Third busiest inland waterway
- Supports local, state, and national economy
- If breached, navigation interrupted
- Costly repairs and extensive dredging would be required





#### **Shoreline Retreat**

- -32 feet/year due to erosion
- Hydrodynamic impacts (waves/storms)
- Sea level rise

- Adaptive management approach

2018-2019

- Atkins Numerical Modeling Study
- Considers 14 alternatives


Summer 2020

   Jan 16, 2024

- 6 -8-month Construction Window for Structures
- Partnership with Galveston District for Beach Nourishment Phase
- BUDM from Mouth of Colorado River
